BOOKS ON REVIEW - During our recent "long hot summer", I found it was most pleasant to turn $\overline{\text{down the A/C}}$ and curl up with a good book. The following are just a few books worthy of calling your attention to:

"DOGS" by Rien Poortvliet. In this book about dogs the artist of "Gnomes" paints and chats about his own pets, as well as others. This is a heartwarming collection of exquisite paintings, drawing and stories and although this book is more entertaining than educational, there are, nonetheless, thoughts on training and dog care included. This is not an inexpensive book, but it is well worth the price. The paintings are to be enjoyed again and again.

"DOG STORIES" By James Herriot. This is a collection of some of Dr. Herriot's favorite patients and stories of his own dogs, as well. This is a book for others of us, who, like Dr. Herriot, have never quite been able to take dogs for granted. This is a "must" for James Herriot fans.

"TEACHING DOG OBEDIENCE CLASSES"— The Manual For Instructors by Jochim Volhard and Gail Tamase Fisher. An excellent book for instructors and anyone interested in learning more about understanding canine behavior and how a dog learns. There are precise outlines for week to week structuring of classes and the drawings by Melissa Bartlett are excellent and add a great deal to the book.
