PLEASE NOTE: The following information pertains to the revised DKC bylaws (a copy of which is enclosed). Please read the following and the bylaws carefully, so you will be informed as to our club's operating procedures. This, and the revised bylaws, are submitted by and have been accomplished through the efforts of Dee Wallis.

Attached to this newsletter is what we hope will be the final draft of the new DKC Bylaws. As you may recall, the membership approved a draft set of bylaws for submission to AKC in early 1988. After extended conversations with AKC, a number of items were revised to meet their requirements.

The major change is that we can no longer have associate members. AKC will not allow the membership to review and approve individuals for full membership after they have been admitted initially. Therefore, our get acquainted process must take place before the individual becomes a member. We will now have member candidates who must participate in the life of the club for at least six months prior to being considered for membership. These candidates must inform the Secretary of their interest in the club, attend at least two meetings and perform at least two services of value to the club as a condition for applying. We will also allow individuals who live far away to subscribe to the newsletter rather than becoming members.

In addition, we must increase our quorum requirement to 20% from 15% (This means additional trouble in getting a quorum at member meetings); and the description of the area for meetings is changed from "within 25 miles of Durham" to read "in the greater Durham area." Finally, there were correction of minor typographical omissions.

The enclosed Bylaws will be voted on in April at the next member meeting. Once approved we will send them for a final stamp of approval by AKC, and then should begin operating under these new rules in early summer. The major change you should notice is that we will have a new fiscal-dues paying-year beginning May 1 rather than January 1 and we will have two Secretaries-Recording and Corresponding-to acknowledge the heavy burden of work that office entails.
