- 2. Connie Howard shares the following information with our membership. If you live in Durham Co. and show your dogs in any AKC event and can provide such proof to the tax office, your dogs can be exempt from the higher tax rate that is charged for non-sterilized pets. The difference in the rate is substantial and would be \$5.00 per dog rather than \$13.00. If you have questions about this give Connie a call. If you call the tax office ask to speak to a supervisor or someone in authority, as Connie has found that not all tax employees are well informed on this issue and may give you incorrect information.
- 3. Please be reminded that DKC members who have keys to the building have a responsibility to see that the building is secure when they leave. Recently, the building (on at least two different occasions) has been found to either have one of the end doors left unlocked or the padlock on the front door was not closed. This is a very important matter. Our building and it's contents represent a great financial investment and it is critical that we all realize the responsibility of protecting that investment. If you have a key to the building, please take the responsibility seriously and be sure that all doors (including the storage room, overhead, door on back wall and end doors, as well as the front doors, incl. the padlock) are secured when you leave.
