CANINE GOOD CITIZENSHIP AWARD

Those DKC members whose dogs have earned a Canine Good Citizenship Certificate during the past year, please complete and return the form that was included, along with other award information, in the June, 1991 newsletter. Stella Maunsell must receive this information no later than December 11, 1991.

DKC AWARDS CRITERIA

The following descriptions of special awards should be of interest to our members and may help in compiling your dog's show record for the upcoming awards program. Please complete and return the Awards Record Form (that you received earlier) to the Awards Committee Chairperson by December 11, 1991. It is important that the awards committee have these forms by this date since time is required to have awards engraved after the recipient has been determined.

HAINES SHOW DOG AWARD - Donated by Vivian and Howard Haines. Awarded annually to the member whose dog has compiled the most outstanding show record for the previous year.

FOWLER SHOW BITCH AWARD - Donated by Herman Fowler. Awarded annually to the member whose bitch has compiled the most impressive show record for the previous year.

DKC STUD DOG AWARD - Donated by Peter Kartye. Offered for the stud dog, owned or co-owned by a member, whose progeny have compiled the most notable record of achievement, in the opinion of the Awards Committee.

DKC BROOD BITCH AWARD - Donated by Peter Kartye. Offered to a brood bitch, owned or co-owned by a member, meeting the same criteria as Stud Dog.

HILL BREEDER'S CUP - Donated by Frances Hill. Awarded annually to a DKC member in recognition of an outstanding breeding program.

DKC PLAQUES - Donated by the Durham Kennel Club to members whose solely owned or co-owned dogs or bitches attained a conformation, obedience or tracking title during the past year, providing Durham Kennel Club membership was active at the time the title was being won. The dog's name, DKC member's name and the year of the award is engraved on the trophy plate.

DKC BREEDER'S CERTIFICATES - Donated by the Durham Kennel Club to members in honor of dogs, bred by the member, who achieved a championship, obedience or tracking degree.

DKC NOVICE OBEDIENCE DOG AWARD - Donated by Dr. and Mrs. Michael Luster. Offered for the dog (either sex), owned or co-owned by a DKC member, earning a CD during the year with the highest average score for the first three qualifying legs. Only the three scores upon which the CD title is based will count toward this award.

DKC OPEN A OBEDIENCE AWARD - Donated by Jeff and Jodi Telander, to be awarded annually to the dog or bitch, owned by a DKC member, earning a CDX, with the highest three qualifying scores in Open A classes.

DKC UTILITY A OBEDIENCE AWARD - Donated by Marjorie J. White, to be offered annually, to recognize the dog or bitch, owned and handled by a DKC member, who, during the previous year, earned a UD from the Utility A classes. The first three qualifying scores, upon which the UD title is earned, are the only scores to be considered in awarding this trophy.

THOMPSON OBEDIENCE TROPHY - Donated by B. J. Thompson. Awarded to the DKC member whose dog or bitch has excelled in obedience during the previous year.

MARY HOLLAND MEMORIAL VERSATILITY AWARD Donated by her husband, Hank Holland, in memory of Mary Holland. Awarded annually to the dog or bitch who receives a championship and at least one obedience or tracking degree within a twelve month period of time.

GRIMSON TRACKING AWARD - Donated by Dr. and Mrs. Keith Grimson, to be awarded to the DKC member whose dog or bitch has distinguished itself in tracking during the past year.
