Bulldog: Dog of the Month



The perfect Bulldog must have a heavy, thick-set , lowslung body, a massive shortfaced head,

wide shoulders, sturdy limbs, with a smooth coat and be of medium size.

The size for mature dogs is about 50 lbs. And for mature bitches about 40 lbs. The circumference of the skull in front of the ears should measure at least the height of the dog at the shoulders. The eyes, from the front, should appear to be placed low down in the skull, as far from the ears as possible. The most desirable ear shape is termed "rose ear". The ear should never be cropped. The coat should be straight, short, flat, close, of fine texture and glossy. It is to be of a uniform color and is preferred in the following order: (1) red brindle, (2) all other brindles, (3) solid white, (4) solid red, fawn, or fallow (5) piebald, (6) inferior qualities of all the previous colors. The gait has a characteristic roll.

Background

The Bulldog originated in England as a bull fighter and is often called the English bulldog. It is thought that many fighting dogs were probably involved in its development in Britain including the mastiff. The bulldog was later used in dogfighting when bull fighting came to be considered inhumane and was banned. After dogfights were banned in 1835, his ferocity was not needed. Breeders, concerned that the Bulldog would become extinct, decided to preserve

its many fine qualities while eliminating its ferocity.

The English Bulldog has some common ancestry with the French Bulldog. [To be discussed in a future article.]

Temperament

The Bulldog, whose admirers consider it the most British of all canines, possesses the qualities Britons display their finest in moments—tenacity, courage, composure. According to the AKC, the disposition should be steady and kind, resolute and courageous (not vicious or aggressive), but calm and dianified.

AKC Delegate's Report

I will be attending the Delegates Meeting on Tuesday, December the 8th and would appreciate input from club members on an issue that is coming up for a vote. There is a proposed amendment to Chapter 3, Section 6 of the Rules Applying to Registration and Discipline, clarifying what is required for the registration of a dog or a litter. If the amendment passes, all current language in Chapter 3, Section 6 will be deleted and replaced with the following statement: "The American Kennel Club must be presented with properly completed paperwork, including all required signatures, in order to register a litter and/or dog. When a disagreement occurs, the parties must resolve it themselves. AKC will abide by the decision of a court." AKC feels that they should not be in the business of interpreting and private contracts, enforcing enforcing co-owner contracts frequently causes AKC to be drawn into costly civil actions. If the amendment passes and a stud dog owner refuses to sign a litter registration, or a co-owner refuses to sign a registration for an individual dog, the parties involved would have no choice but to hire attorneys and go to court if they could not resolve the issue themselves. Agility
