Doberman Pinscher: Dog of the Month



The Doberman Pinscher is as intelligent as it is beautiful. When the Dobe is correctly bred and trained, it is a friend and a

guardian. Its ability to absorb and retain training have caused it to be in demand as a police and war dog. It has an excellent nose that can adapt to criminal training or hunting.

This breed demands training with affection. The Doberman needs close contact with human beings that can be fulfilled by living as a house dog and member of the family. Unfortunately, this dog is often found in unsuitable homes where it is denied the affection it needs.

Background: The Doberman Pinscher is a fairly new breed, developed in the 1870s by Herr Louis Doberman of Germany. By using crosses of shorthaired shepherd-dog stock with Rottweiler, Black and Tan Terrier and smooth-haired German Pinscher, a rough form of the breed was produced by 1890. The Doberman Pinscher Club was formed in 1921.

Show Ring: Dobes are allowed 4 colors: black, red, blue and fawn. All have sharply defined rust markings which appear over each eye and on the muzzle, throat and forechest, on all legs and feet and below the tail. Many blue and fawn dogs have skin and coat problems. Some breeders sell these as "rare and valuable" and charge more for a dog which is more likely to lose its coat. Dogs may be from 26 to 28 inches at the withers, with the ideal at 27½ inches and

bitches are from 24 to 26 inches with the ideal at 25½ inches

Breed Disqualifications: The only disqualifications are overshot more than .3/16th of an inch, undershot more than 1/8th of an inch, dogs not of an allowed color and four or more missing teeth. A judge is expected to dismiss any shy or vicious Doberman from the ring.

Recognized Problems: Cervical vertebral instability (CVI) Wobbler Syndrome is a serious problem in Dobermans. It often does not show up until the dog is past his prime. There is no known cause, but diet and genetics may be involved. Alopecia (dry, lusterless hair coat, scaliness and papules) is most commonly found in blue Dobermans. Dobes also have a high incidence of demodicosis and are at greater risk of developing VWD and osteo-Narcolepsy, Dancing sarcomas. Doberman disease and Immune Complex disorders (ICD), also, appear to be breed concerns.
