## Skye Terrier: Dog of the Month



The Skye Terrier is a dog of style and dignity. It is agile and strong with

sturdy bone and hard muscle. It is twice as long as it is high and covered with a profuse coat that falls down on either side of its body. There are two varieties differing only in ear carriage: prick and drop ear.

The Skye is of suitable size for hunting. Its temperament is fearless, good natured, loyal and careful. It is very friendly with those it knows, but reserved with strangers. It is not a breed for everyone, but is considered an ideal companion breed for the city.

**Background:** The Skye Terrier takes its name from the Island of Skye off the northwest coast of Scotland. The breed became popular during the reign of Queen Victoria. It was first registered by the AKC in 1887.

**Show Ring:** The average height at the shoulder is 10 in. for dogs and 9.5 in. for bitches with an ideal ratio of body length to shoulder height being 2 to 1. Acceptable colors are black, blue, gray, silver, platinum, fawn or cream. A common fault in cream Skyes is lack of black points.

**Breed Disqualifications:** A Dudley, flesh colored, or brown nose is a disqualification.

**Breeding and Whelping:** Breeding prick-ear to drop-ear can cause many ear problems, such as weak-eared prick, low-placed ears, semi-prick ears, soft or tulip or drop ears carried with a lift and ears not symmetrical in carriage. The German breeding rules are more strict than ours. These

prohibit breeding prick-eared with drop-eared varieties.

Breeding cream to cream seems to cause a loss of pigmentation in the black points of the ear feathering, muzzle and tail.

The bite is very important. The undershot or overshot bite is a handicap in a working terrier.

**Recognized Problems:** **Kink tail** is a common genetic fault which shows at birth. **Ulcerative colitis** is a breed problem in Germany. Skyes are susceptible to **inhalant allergies**. Of the dogs surveyed in a recent study, 45% had some type of allergy and 22% of the allergic dogs had **autoimmune thyroid disease**. A condition called **Skye hepatitis** is a fatal disease generally affecting young dogs. **Piddling** or **wet puppies** are ones with weak bladders. These are always wet around the tail.

## AKC Delegate's Report

March 14, 2000 - I was once again privileged to attend the most recent delegate's meeting as DKC's representative. The meeting was held on Tuesday, March 14 in New York City, and the main order of business was the annual election for AKC board seats. There were three vacant board positions and the nominating committee duly nominated three candidates - Dr. Thomas M. Davies, Walter F. Goodman, and Ronald H. Menaker. An additional candidate, Robert H. McKowen, was nominated from the floor. Following a short period in which the candidates had a chance to address the delegate body, votes were cast, and Tom Davies, Walter Goodman, and Ron Menaker were elected on the first ballot – a rare occurrence! There were 356 delegates in attendance and the vote tally was as follows: Goodman, 280 votes; Menaker, 272 votes; Davies, 271 votes; and McKowen, 142 votes. Your delegate voted for Davies, Goodman, and Menaker, basing her decisions on personal knowledge of the candidates and on their stated goals and plans as an AKC board member.

After the election, the delegates voted on three amendments to the Field Trial Rules and Standard Procedure for Pointing Breeds. The first of these changed Chapter 14, Section 2 so that an amateur can now run up to three dogs owned by other amateurs in Amateur Stakes. Previously, an amateur could only run two. The second change was to Chapter 14, Section 7 (Paragraph 1), which corrected terminology for the Puppy and Derby Stakes held by pointing breed field trial clubs. The final amendment changed Chapter 14, Section 7 (Paragraph 5) so that championship points will be credited to dogs placing both first and second in regular classes with 25 or more starters. The actual number of points will be based on the number of

eligible starters. This change will reward the dog who worked exceptionally well in a large field yet did not win the stake. All three of these amendments passed and your delegate voted in favor of each of them.

In other business, the East Tennessee Retriever Club and the Woman's Field Trial Club were elected as new member clubs, and a proposed amendment to the Disciplinary Articles and Sections of the AKC Constitution and Bylaws was read. These amendments delegate more authority to Trial Boards and AKC staff to handle disciplinary matters within board-approved guidelines. The amendments are quite extensive and I will discuss them more fully in my next report, as I would like input on them before the delegates are asked to approve the changes. There was quite a bit of discussion about the new program the board approved to license professional handlers, and the delegate body voted to ask the board to reconsider this program, although this was a non-binding request and it probably won't have much impact on the board's decision. The next meeting will be held in San Diego, California, in June, and I will report on the agenda when it becomes available.

## Pet Passports

PETS was introduced with a pilot scheme which started on Feb. 28, 2000. This will test the new system and will apply only to pet cats and dogs coming into Britain from Andorra, Australia, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Gibraltar, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Monaco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal and San Marino. Guide dogs and hearing dogs coming from

Australia and New Zealand may also be included in the pilot scheme.

Under the new rules abolishing quarantine for dogs and cats that have pet passports, animals must be tagged with a microchip, vaccinated against rabies and pass a full health check before leaving for any of the 19 European countries in the scheme. Since the bill for each pet will probably be 250 pounds and the process takes more than six months, planning well in advance of a holiday is essential.

The only ferry routes at present open to British pet owners are between Dover and Calais, and between Portsmouth and Caen, Cherbourg, Le Havre and St Malo. But pets can also be carried in vehicles using Eurotunnel's Shuttle service between Folkestone and Calais.

An animal landed without a license will be either directed to quarantine, re-exported or destroyed and its owner prosecuted. Serious offences may be tried on indictment at a Crown Court where offenders are liable to penalties of up to a year's imprisonment an unlimited fine or both. Because of these penalties, it is important to ensure that all the licensing requirements are met.

The scheme will be extended in 2001 to include other species of pets and other countries.

Eleven breed champions, twenty obedience titles, 10 performance titles (including tracking, hunting, and herding), and twenty-two agility titles were garnered by our outstanding dogs.

Special recognition was given to three dogs that achieved the OTCH title: Yankee Irrepressible UDX OA AXJ, Keeshond owned/handled by Marion Crain, Tystar Meg UD, Border Collie owned/handled by Sally Glei, and Sleepy Eye Bluegrass Medley UDX, Shetland Sheepdog owned/handled by Jenny Glei. In addition, two dogs earned Perfect 200 scores: Tystar Meg UD, Border Collie owned/handled by Sally Glei, and Carrie UDX, Shetland Sheepdog owned/handled by Gwen Millner. And Ch Tahari's Serious Beesness JH, a Pointer owned/handled by Peggy Schmidt, was honored as a Best In Specialty Show winner for his success at the breed National Specialty.

Canine Good Citizen certificates were awarded to 12 dogs, and seven of members received Breeder's Certificates for the achievements of dogs they had bred.

### Newest Trophy Awarded

The Pitz Agility Trophy was awarded for the first time to OTCH Tystar Little Dipper UDX MX MXJ, Border Collie owned/handled by Mary Whorton. Dipper achieved a total of 992 points in order to capture the trophy.

## Service and Sportsmanship

The 1999 DKC Good Sportsmanship Award was given to Emilie Beglane. Emilie was chosen for her sense of fair play, her honesty, humility in wins and losses, and encouragement of others.

Two men were honored for their selfless service to the club during 1999, and were given bronze DKC Service Medallions. Jeff Telander has supported the physical plant with great enthusiasm and organization, from repairs, to painting, to flooring and beyond. Jack Sappenfield has assisted at both conformation and obedience events as well as coordinating the tracking events DKC holds several times a year.

Emilie, Jeff and Jack were roundly applauded and thanked for their service to the club.

## Dog World Award

Every two years the Durham Kennel Club submits a name to Dog World Inc. for the honor of the Dog World Award for Outstanding Service. This award is given in recognition of an individual's contribution to the world of dogs in its broadest sense. The 1999 award was presented, with great affirmation from all present, to Marge White. Her citation read in part: *The success of any organization can be measured by the dedication of its members. Within the Durham Kennel Club, that dedication is found most perfectly in Marge. For over twenty years, Marge has supported our club's endeavors with whole-hearted sincerity and selflessness. Her leadership, common sense and experience enrich our programs; her humility, kindness, charity and integrity inspire many to act likewise. Beyond our small club Marge is something of an ambassador of the dog world to the general public, active in rescue efforts, therapy dog service, education, and most recently spearheading efforts to provide bullet-proof vests for the dogs of the Durham Police K-9 Team.* To Marge, we all say a resounding "thank you" for all you've done for us and for the four-legged, furred and tail-wagging animals we call our companions. May you have many more years to love them!
