Akita: Dog of the Month



The Akita, a member of the working group, was approved by the AKC Dec. 12, 1972. Akitas combine good nature,

dignity, courage, alertness and docility, but can be aggressive toward strange dogs. They are not destructive nor barkers and are easily who those trained bν have established leadership over them.

In recent times, the uses of Akitas have broadened beyond hunting. They can pull a heavier sled load than most breeds of Alaskan dogs. They have keen noses, sight and hearing. Their feet can handle any type of terrain.

The Akita is double-coated with an under-coat that is thick, soft, dense and shorter than the outer. His outer coat is straight, harsh and standing somewhat off the body.

Background

The breed takes its name from the Prefecture on the main Japanese island of Honshu, where it was originally developed and bred. The original Akita was the result of breeding the Kari, the Tosa Fighting Dog, and other breeds imported from Europe. In the beginning only royalty could own an Akita. Each dog was served by appointed attendants. Great ceremony surrounded everyday actions such as training, eating and drinking. Much spiritual significance has been attached to the Akita. The Japanese government has declared the breed a national monument of Japan and one of Japan's national treasures. Every champion dog is declared a National Art Treasure and made a ward of the government.

Show Ring:

Any color including white; brindle; or pinto is accepted, but any indication of ruff or feathering is a fault. Males are 26 to 28 inches at the withers and bitches 24 to 26 inches. **Disqualifications:** Butterfly nose or total lack of pigmentation on nose, Drop or broken ears, Noticeably undershot or overshot, Sickle or uncurled tail and Dogs under 25 inches; bitches under 23 inches.

Breeding and Whelping: Akitas usually whelp easily but slowly. A litter usual averages 6, but 10 is not uncommon. Growth rates vary. Some do not reach full size until 4 years.

Recognized Problems: Hip and elbow dysplasia, congenital deafness and hypothyroid and hyperthyroid problems are not uncommon. Some Akitas are very sensitive to anesthetics and like many Japanese breeds, there is an inherited susceptibility to onion poisoning.

Old Age
