# Pointer: Dog of the Month



The **Pointer**, a member of the sporting group fully

deserves his name. He was the first dog, as far as is known, to stand game in the sense that the term is used today.

The ideal specimen gives the immediate impression of compact power and agile grace. He is full of nervous energy and put together with speed, endurance, courage and the ability to concentrate on the job; he is an ideal dog for the person who is looking for results in the field.

**Background:** Pointers appeared in England about 1650 and were used to locate and point hares before guns were used in the field.

It is believed that the Foxhound, Greyhound, and Bloodhound are part of his lineage. Dogs bred from pure field strains are generally smaller than those bred from show lines, but from earliest times, he has been bred for type as well as field ability. The Pointer was Approved by the AKC November 11, 1975.

**Show Ring:** Height should be 25 to 28 inches for dogs and from 23 to 26 for bitches. Weight is 55 to 75 pounds for dogs and 45 to 65 for bitches.

The coat is short, dense and smooth with a sheen. The color varieties are liver, lemon, black and orange either in combination with white or solid-colored. A good pointer cannot be a bad color. In the darker colors, the nose should

be brown or black; in the lighter shades, it may be lighter or flesh colored.

**Breeding** Whelping: and Pointers. generally, are easy They may whelpers. whelp. though, as early as the 59<sup>th</sup> day. Litter size ranges from 6 to 16 puppies and birth weight varies from 10 to 18 ounces. Undershot mouths are common in Pointers. This defect may not be obvious until the dog is 8 to 9 months old.

Breed Disqualifications: The AKC does not list any disqualifications, but in the breed ring, light eyes, white or mottled ears, long "houndy" ears, shallowness, lack of rib spring and poor movement are extremely undesirable.

**Recognized Problems:** Pointers have few inherited defects, but they are subject to **Entropion** (usually of the lower eyelid).

**Old Age:** Average life span is **12 to 15 years.** Dogs kept in kennels and those worked very hard in the field may not live this long.
