# Shih Tzu: Dog of the Month



The **Shih Tzu** is a sturdy, lively, alert toy dog. Befitting his noble Chinese ancestry as a highly valued, prized companion

and palace pet, the Shih Tzu is proud of bearing, has a distinctively arrogant carriage with head well up and tail curved over the back. Although there has always been considerable size variation, the Shih Tzu must be compact, solid, carrying good weight and substance. The sole purpose of the Shih Tzu is that of a companion and house pet and it is essential that its temperament be outgoing, happy, affectionate, friendly and trusting towards all.

Background: The Shih Tzu takes its name from the Chinese Shih Tzu Kou (Lion Dog). Its ancestors appeared in Tibetan recorded history as holy dogs as early as the 7th century A.D. During the Manchu dynasty (1642-1912), Shih Tzus were preferred gifts to monarchs and were bred by them. After 1908, smugglers introduced them to visitors from Great Britain. It was at first called the Tibetan Poodle or Lhasa Lion Dog by the Chinese Kennel Club, but the Shih Tzu was soon distinguished from the Lhasa Apso by English breeders. The Shih Tzu was first recognized by the AKC in 1968, approved on May 9, 1989; which became effective June 29, 1989.

Show Ring: Ideally, the height at the withers is 9 to 101/2 inches; but, not less than 8 inches nor more than 11 inches. The ideal weight of mature dogs is 9 to 16 pounds. The length between withers and root of tail is slightly longer than the height at withers. The Shih Tzu must never be so high stationed as to appear leggy, nor so low stationed as to appear dumpy or squatty. Regardless of size, the Shih Tzu is always compact, solid

and carries good weight and substance. The bite should be slightly undershot and the jaw broad and wide.

The coat is luxurious, double-coated, dense, long, and flowing. A slight wave is permissible. The hair on the top of the head is tied up. Trimming of the feet, the bottom of the coat, and the anus may be done for neatness and to facilitate movement. All colors and markings are permissible and are to be considered equally.

**Breeding and Whelping:** Litters average 3 to 4 puppies, each puppy weighing an average of 6 ounces at birth.

Breed Disqualifications: There are no breed disqualifications. Faults include: Sparse coat, single coat, curly coat, excessive trimming, pinkness on the nose or eye rims and *snipyness*.

Recognized Problems: The major hereditary defects of the breed are cleft lip and palate. Renal cortical hypoplasia is in some lines where symptoms begin at about 1 year.

**Old Age: Shih Tzus** are hardy dogs that live to be 12 to 14 years old.

## **Toy Danger**

A pet toy, the Wiggly Giggly ball is a hidden danger as it contains zinc-coated whistles encased in plastic. The ball packaging gives no warnings as to metal contents, so it appears rather safe. The toy was featured on the Oprah Winfrey show last Christmas season and received the 1999 Toy of the Year award. It's a rugged green ball, without batteries, decorated with paw prints and makes amusing noises. The exact same ball has been marketed for children, but lacks the paw prints.

If a pet should ingest metal (confirmed by x-ray), it is to be considered a MEDICAL EMERGENCY and extracted immediately via endoscope or surgery.

## Gene Therapy Restores Dog Vision

AP: April 30, 2001, NEW YORK -Using gene therapy, scientists have restored vision in dogs with a version of a rare disease that blinds human infants. The work may lead to treatments for several genetic forms of blindness. The dogs had a version of Leber congenital amaurosis, an untreatable condition that causes near total blindness in infancy. Perhaps 10,000 Americans have it, and about 1,000 of them have the particular genetic defect corrected in the dogs, said researcher Dr. Jean Bennett.

The dogs were blind because they lacked a particular gene. Without it, their eyes could not make a pigment necessary to perceive light. The therapy was designed to deliver working copies of the gene to their eyes. Researchers used eye surgery to deliver a dose of the gene, carried by a virus that deposited the gene within eye cells. Four months after treatment, several tests showed the animals had regained at least some sight in the treated eye.

Bennett, an associate professor of ophthalmology the University of Pennsylvania, and colleagues report their experiments on three Briard dogs in the May issue of the journal Nature Genetics.
