Great Dane: Dog of the Month



The Great Dane, a member of the Working Group, is a gentle and alert guard dog that conducts itself with tact even in small apartments. The spirited. him as

AKC describes courageous and always friendly and dependable.

Background: The Great Dane was originally bred in Germany to run down and fight the wild boar. There is no known reason to connect him with Denmark. The name comes from grand Danois meaning "big Danish" (in French) and was only one of many names given to this dog, but it was this one that was selected by the English.

The Great Dane was approved by the AKC on Sept. 11, 1990 (Effective: Oct. 30, 1990). This approval was updated Mar. 8, 1999 (Effective April 28, 1999).

Show Ring: Ears should be high set, medium in size and of moderate thickness, folded forward close to the cheek. The top line of the folded ear should be level with the skull. If cropped. the ear length is in proportion to the size of the head and the ears are carried uniformly erect. Whiskers may be trimmed or left natural.

The Great Dane comes in six (revision 1999) color types: Brindle, Fawn, Blue, White, Harlequin (pure white base with black torn patches) and Mantle (black and white with a solid black blanket extending over the body; black skull with white muzzle; white blaze is optional; whole white collar is preferred; a white chest; white on part or whole of forelegs and hind legs; white tipped black tail. A small white marking in the blanket is acceptable, as is a break in the white collar). The male shall not be less than 30 inches at the shoulders, but it is preferable that he be 32 inches or more, providing he is well proportioned to his height. The female shall not be less than 28 inches at the shoulders, but it is preferable that she be 30 inches or more.

Breeding and Whelping: The whelps weigh from \(^3\)4 to 1 \(^1\)2 lbs, with an average litter of from 8 to 10 puppies. Pregnancy and whelping are generally trouble free, but the bitch must be watched for the first 3 days after whelping so that she does not accidentally smother the puppies.

Breed Disqualifications: Danes under minimum height, split nose, docked tail, and any color other than those described.

Faults: Haws and Mongolian eyes, undershot jaws, a ring or hooked tail and wolf claws.

Recognized Problems: Bloat (Danes are rated #1 in risk), Elbow dysplasia, (young. Osteosarcoma. **Tonsillitis Possible** growing Danes). skin problems. Many Great Danes do not tolerate milk.

Old Age: The average life span is 5 to 8 vears.


