# Australian Shepherd: Dog of the Month



The Australian Shepherd is an working intelligent of strong dog herdina and auardina instincts. He is а loval.

intelligent companion and has the stamina to work all day. He is well balanced, slightly longer than tall, of medium size and bone, with coloring that offers variety and individuality. He is attentive and animated, lithe and agile, solid and muscular. He has a coat of moderate length and coarseness. He has a docked or natural bobbed tail which should not exceed four inches in length as an adult.

Background: There are many theories about the origin of the Australian Shepherd, but the breed as we know it originated in the US. It probably had its roots in the Basque region of the Pyrenees Mountains between Spain and France, and was called the Australian Shepherd because of its association with Basque shepherds who came to the United States from Australia in the 1800s. These dogs were originally called by many names, including Spanish Shepherd, Pastor Dog, Bob-Tail, Blue Heeler, New Mexican Shepherd and California Shepherd.

The Australian Shepherd approved by the AKC on May 14, 1991; effective January 1, 1993

Show Ring: -- The preferred height for males is 20-23 inches, females 18-21 inches. Measuring from the breastbone to rear of thigh and from top of the withers to the ground the Australian Shepherd is slightly longer than tall. Hair is of medium texture, straight to wavy, weather resistant and of medium length. The undercoat varies in quantity with variations in climate. He comes in 4 acceptable colors: black, blue merle, red and red merle. Eves are brown, blue, amber or any variation or combination thereof, including flecks and marbling: almond shaped, not protruding nor sunken. The blue merles and blacks have black pigmentation on eye rims. The red merles and reds have liver (brown) pigmentation on eye rims.

Breeding and Whelping: Delivery is normal and easy. The bitch exhibits an intense mothering instinct and a strong milking ability. Males tend to be very accepting of puppies. Litter size ranges from 5 to 10, with birth weight from ½ to 1 lb. Dewclaws are not removed on working dogs.

Litters from 2 merled (heterozygous) parents will produce an average of 25% homozygous merles. These euthanized at birth.

Breed Disqualifications: Undershot. Overshot greater than 1/8 White body splashes, which means white on body between withers and tail, on sides between elbows and back of hindquarters in all colors.

Faults: Prick ears, pendulous, low-set ears and non-typical coats are severe faults. Any display of shyness, fear or aggression is to be severely penalized.

Recognized Problems: Mild umbilical hernias, hip dysplasia and ocular anomalies are seen in this breed. Hereditary deafness is associated with the presence of the merle and piebald genes. Incidents of ivermectin and piperazine toxicosis have occurred. Australian Shepherds have the highest incidence of nasal solar dermatitis.

Old Age: The average life span is 10 to 15 years.

## **DKC Spring Agility Trials**

Our 2002 spring agility trials on April 20 and 21 were a huge success thanks to the many club and exhibitor volunteers. We received well over 500 entries for our 300 run limit. Not even all the entries received opening day got in.

Thursday night before the trials, the agility class members all helped load the equipment onto the trailer. With everyone helping this took about 30 minutes. Friday afternoon we hauled the trailer out to the Rougemont property where we unloaded, hammered rebars, the strung fencing, set up tents for the secretary and one at each ring for the exhibitors. This took about 2 hours with lots of people.

Saturday morning began at 7 out at the site to start building courses. At 8 am, the judge announced excellent briefing for the first class. Afterwards she met with all the ring crew scribe, timer, assistant scribe and timer, gate steward, ring crew and more to make sure all were present and knew what to do. The first dog was called to the line shortly after that. There are 5 jump heights in each class and whenever a height is completed, the ring crew rushes up to reset bars and change the table height. In the meantime, at the rate of about one every 2 minutes, the scribe sheets are brought from the ring, calculated at the secretary's table and recorded into 3 separate catalogs - one for the club, one for the judge, and one for AKC. The scores and times are also transcribed to a class sheet which is posted for all exhibitors to see. Placement and green ribbons are labeled for the qualifiers. At the end of the class, ribbons and toys are awarded to all the qualifiers. Peggy Schmidt did a great job with this as always. New titles are announced. and smiles are visible on many faces! We finish all runs about 4 pm.

That night move ups to a higher class level are recorded by the

secretary. New catalogs, scribe sheets, and gate boards are printed. Sunday morning we start all over again with a repeat of the day before. There were no major problems, just a grumble or two from unhappy exhibitors who did not qualify. The excellent jumpers class was most exciting as we all got to watch our very own Tracy Fletcher finish his MACH (Master Agility Championship) title on his Sheltie, Tess. This is only the second MACH for the Durham Kennel Club. Tracy and Tess took a victory lap around the ring to the cheers of friends and family as he clutched the traditional last bar in his hand. Way to go Tracy! The MACH title represents the ultimate achievement in agility and is well deserved by this team.

For the remainder of the day, the weather was dry and hot reaching close to 90 degrees with only a slight breeze and a few clouds. We finished around 4 and took down the fencing and tents. The equipment was loaded into the trailer and hauled back to DKC. There it was all unloaded and put away by 5:30. The only remaining business was for the catalogs and reports to be sent to AKC along with the recording fees of \$3 per dog.

A tremendous thanks to: Emilie Beglane who was always ready to take care of any financial matters with a smile. George Beglane who never seemed to run out of energy up to the last unloading of the Aframe into the building. He was always there hammering, stretching fencing, assembling the tents (it seems no one else can ever figure out how they go together), nailing down equipment, building courses, and of course his favorite - gate steward. Sharon Pitz who organized all the refreshments for the workers. Denise who supervised all the workers and covered the last minute no shows. Tracy Fletcher who built all 12 courses and helped set up Friday and unload Sunday. most of all, Richard Whorton, trial secretary. Richard makes it look

easy, however, that is simply not the case. That job is tremendous and many clubs hire their secretaries because it is such an enormous job, very few are willing to do it. The secretary gets asked everything. So while he is trying to calculate and record the scores, he may get asked where are they measuring dogs, do I have to get my dog measured, where are the porta potties, are there any extra armbands cuz they already lost theirs from the day before, where are the scribe sheets, what was the course time for yesterday's open jumper course 16", could they look at their scribe sheet from 3 classes earlier, can they buy a catalog, how many refusals are you allowed in novice, and the best one of all when are the sporting breeds showing. He answered all questions with great patience.

There were many many more people who helped in a number of ways including some new faces we had not seen before such as Martin Bourque who helped all day Sunday including unloading the trailer. There were at least 50 folks helping each day and we are grateful to each and every one of you for helping put on our best trials yet. Our next trials are Sept 28 and 29. See you all then.
