Miniature Schnauzer. Dog of the Month



The Miniature Schnauzer, a member of the Terrier Group, is a robust, active dog of terrier type, resembling his lar-

ger cousin, the Standard Schnauzer, in general appearance, and of an alert, active disposition, yet obedient to command. He is friendly, intelligent and willing to please. He should never be overaggressive or timid. The basic good health, good temperament, nonshedding and attractive appearance make Miniature Schnauzers admirably suited as pets.

Background: The Schnauzer is of German origin and has been recognized in pictures as far back as the 15th century. The **Miniature** Schnauzer is derived from the Standard Schnauzers and is said to have come from mixing Affenpincers and Poodles with small Standards.

The Miniature Schnauzer was exhibited as a distinct breed as early as 1899. The American Miniature Schnauzer Club began its independent operation in August 1933.

The current standards for the Miniature Schnauzer were approved by the AKC on Jan. 15, 1991; effective Feb. 27, 1991.

Show Ring: --The preferred height is 12 to 14. The coat is double with a hard, wiry, outer coat and a close undercoat. The head, neck, ears, chest, tail, and body coat must be plucked. Allowable colors are Salt and Pepper, Black and Silver and Black (the only allowable solid color).

Breeding and Whelping: Experience has shown that Miniature Schnauzers are lazy whelpers and about 15% have to be aided by cesarean section. The bitches have

trouble removing the fetal membranes and often require help. The average litter is between 3 and 5 pups and normal birth weights range from 4 to 9 ounces. Dewclaws should be removed and tails docked as soon as about the 3rd or 4th day.

Breed Disqualifications: Dogs or bitches under 12 inches or over 14 inches. Color solid white or white striping, patching, or spotting on the colored areas of the dog, except for the small white spot permitted on the chest of the black.

Faults: Toyishness, ranginess or coarseness, eyes light and/or large and prominent, head coarse and cheeky, bite—undershot, overshot, or level, chest too broad or shallow in brisket, hollow or roach back, tail set too low, loose elbows, sickle, cow or open hocks and bowed hindquarters, coat too soft or smooth and slick in appearance, single tracking, sidegaiting. Weak rear action.

Recognized Problems: Urinary Track problems, persistent Mullerian duct syndrome (PMDS), VMD, follicular dermatitis, food and inhalant allergies.

Old Age: The average life span is 12 to 13 years.

CALIFORNIA BREEDING BILL DIES September 05, 2002

SB1373, which would have placed new requirements on breeders and pet dealers in California, died when the legislature adjourned on August 31st. The bill had been granted reconsideration when it narrowly failed to pass the Senate in June, but thanks to persistent grassroots lobbying by California fanciers, Sen. Jack O'Connell could not garner the votes needed for passage of his legislation before the session ended. SB1373 would have required breeders and pet dealers to register with a local animal control agency and pay a fee, as

well as list their "registration fee receipt number" in any advertisement associated with the sale of an animal. Breeders and pet dealers would also have been responsible for microchipping dogs and cats, and ensuring that the new owner's identification was registered in a local or national database.

This victory would not have been possible without the countless purebred dog owners who contacted their Senators and expressed their opposition to SB1373 not once, but on several occasions. Your strong grassroots campaign convinced legislators that SB1373 would only have placed expensive, intrusive burdens on hobby breeders while doing little to benefit California pet purchasers. Congratulations!

DOGS AGAINST STRESS

Sept. 24, 2002; NEW YORK (Reuters Health) - Pets may not only provide good company for their owners, they may also help lower stress, according to new study findings.

"Pets can actually provide cardiovascular benefits to their owners," lead study author Dr. Karen Allen of the State University of New York at Buffalo told Reuters Health.

This finding is based on a study involving 240 married couples, half of whom owned a cat or dog. The researchers investigated the effect of the participants' spouses, their pets, and close friends-for non-pet owners--on their responses to stress. Stressful situations included being evaluated while performing mental arithmetic or immersing a hand in ice water for 2 minutes. All of the participants had normal blood pressures.

When at rest, pet owners had much lower heart rates and blood pressure levels than did their non-pet-owning peers, Allen and her colleagues report in the September/October issue of the journal Psychosomatic Medicine.

Heart rates and blood pressure levels were at their highest when pet owners and non-pet-owners, respectively, performed mental arithmetic in their spouse's presence, study findings indicate. When the pet owner performed the same task in the presence of both his or her spouse and their dog or cat, however, his or her heart rate and blood pressure would climb much less sharply.

These "findings make us think about social support in a new way, and suggests that such support can indeed cross species," Allen said.
