Irish Wolfhound: DOG OF THE MONTH



The Irish Wolfhound, a member of the Hound Group, and the tallest of the coursing hounds, is in appearance like a rough-

like a roughl is remarkable in

coated Greyhound and is remarkable in combining power and swiftness with keen sight. His patient, thoughtful, intelligent character makes him an ideal companion dog, but he needs a large exercise area. He is good with children, but reserved with strangers.

Background: The Irish Wolfhound was first mentioned in the year 391 A.D. when the Roman Consul received 7 of them as a gift which was viewed with wonder by all of Rome. This breed was prominent in the feudal life of the Middle Ages and was formerly used to hunt deer, wolf and boar.

Approved by the AKC September 12, 1950.

Show Ring: Size: The minimum height and weight of dogs should be 32 inches and 120 pounds; of bitches, 30 inches and 105 pounds; these to apply only to hounds over 18 months of age. Eyes: dark. Ears: small, with Greyhound like Coat: rough and hard, carriage. especially wiry and long over the eyes and under the jaw. Feet: moderately large and round; toes, close, well arched. Tail: long and slightly curved. Color: The recognized colors are grav. brindle, red, black, pure white, fawn or any other color that appears in the Deerhound.

Breeding and Whelping: The average age of first estrus is 14 to 18 months with 2 years not being unusual. Single births do occur and the average litter size is 4 pups. Birth weight of dogs is about 1 and a half pounds with bitches slightly less. The pups are usually dark at birth, but some have white markings. Their colors appear as they grow older.

Dewclaws should be removed at 3 days. The IWCA recommends puppies up to a year be fed 4 to 5 times a day. Some breeders suggest 3 feedings a day for adult dogs to avoid bloat.

Faults: Too light or heavy a head, too highly arched frontal bone; large ears and hanging flat to the face; short neck; full dewlap; too narrow or too broad a chest; sunken or hollow or quite straight back; bent forelegs; overbent fetlocks; twisted feet; spreading toes; too curly a tail; weak hindquarters and a general want of muscle; too short in body. Lips or nose liver-colored or lacking pigmentation.

Disqualifications: None.

Recognized Problems: Irish Wolfhounds are subject to tail injury and elbow hygroma (fluid sacs). Medication may also be a problem. Dosages of anesthesia and worm medicine should not be determined strictly according to weight. Because of low body fat, this breed is very sensitive to barbiturate anesthetics. Rhinitis syndrome appears in puppies and may progress. Hip dysplasia and metabolic bone diseases occur as in all giant breeds.

Old Age: Of those who survive to one year, the average age for dogs is 5 years and for bitches 6.6 years.

AKC Organizes Shipments of Toys and Treats to Military Dogs in Iraq

[Wednesday, December 22, 2004]

The American Kennel Club (AKC) recently organized a relief effort to aid the working canines serving in Iraq after receiving word from a military veterinary technician serving overseas that "rest and relaxation" supplies were greatly needed. While the dogs are provided for in terms of basic care, many were without recreational toys and treats, which

help alleviate stress and anxiety through play.

Thirty boxes of various items – collected from The Hartz Mountain Corporation, Nylabone, The lams Company and Cherrybrook Pet Supply – were sent to kennels in two U.S. Army units, which maintain large kennels of K9 teams. Items included disc flyer toys, AKC Christmas stockings, pull toys, rawhide chews, rubber chew toys, AKC-licensed treats and glow-in-thedark Frisbees, as well as blankets, cool-down towels and water dishes.

"From bomb detection to search and rescue, these canines provide an invaluable and critical service to our troops overseas," said Dennis B. Sprung, President and CEO of the AKC.
