Whippet: DOG OF THE MONTH



The **Whippet**, a member of the Hound Group, is the fastest domestic animal of its weight, capable of speeds up to 35

mph. They make excellent house dogs and are smart, obedient and responsive to training.

Background: The Whippet was developed in England as a racing dog during the middle of the last century. It first made its entry into the US in Massachusetts which was the center of Whippet racing. Later the sport moved to Baltimore.

Approved by the AKC Aug. 10, 1993; Effective Sept. 29, 1993

Show Ring: Size: Ideal height for dogs, 19 to 22 inches; for bitches, 18 to 21 inches. Eyes: Large and dark. Both eyes must be of the same color. Ears: Rose ears, small, fine in texture. Coat: Short, close, smooth and firm in texture. Feet: More hare than cat, but both are acceptable. Tail: long and tapering – carried low when dog is in motion. Color: immaterial.

Breeding and Whelping: Whippets are slow to mature. Bitches often do not have their first estrus until they are past 2 years of age. They breed easily and gestate normally. The average litter size is 6 - 8 pups, but 9 - 11 are not uncommon. The pups average 8 - 12 oz. at birth and grow quickly. They are very active and can be rough in play and destructive chewers. They need meat and high protein foods and need to be kept lean, strong and in hard muscle to look well. Dew claws may be removed.

Penalties: Yellow or light eyes. Lack of underjaw. Nose entirely black. A short thick neck, or a ewe neck. steep or flat croup. A steep shoulder, short upper arm, a heavily muscled or loaded shoulder, or a very narrow shoulder, all of which restrict low free movement.

Bowed legs, tied-in elbows, legs lacking substance, legs set far under the body so as to create an exaggerated forechest, weak or upright pasterns. Flat, splayed or soft feet without thick hard pads. Sickle or cow hocks. Lack of front reach or rear drive, or a short, hackney gait with high wrist action. Crossing in front or moving too close.

Disqualifications: More than one-half inch above or below stated height limits. Blue or wall eyes. Undershot, overshot one-quarter inch or more. Any coat other than short, close, smooth and firm in texture.

Recognized Problems: Cryptorchidism is a large problem for Whippets. They <u>seldom</u> have hip dysplasia or a tendency to bloat. Some pink-skinned, white and parti-colored dogs are prone to demodectic mange. They are inclined to weak digestive tracts and have a variable tolerance for anesthetics.

Old Age: Whippets that are well cared for live 12 to 16 years..

FDA slams Novartis on dog painkiller

Agency says drugmaker withheld data showing deaths with drug similar to Vioxx. December 28, 2004: 12:54 PM EST WASHINGTON (Reuters) - Novartis AG failed to give the government prompt, accurate reports about deaths of dogs treated with a painkiller in the same class of medicines now linked to heart problems in humans, U.S. regulators have charged in a letter.

The drug, Deramaxx [known generically as deracoxib.], is a COX-2 inhibitor approved for relieving arthritis and post-surgical pain in dogs.

The Food and Drug Administration, in a warning letter dated Nov. 29, said Novartis Animal Health Services should have forwarded complaints about deaths and health problems in dogs given Deramaxx within 15 working days, but in some cases delayed as long as 10 months. Some reports, including ones involving deaths, appeared to have incorrect dates, the FDA said.

The company also failed to submit proper information about post-approval studies of Deramaxx, the FDA charged.
