#### Welsh Terrier:

DOG OF THE MONTH

The Welsh Terrier, a member of the



Terrier Group, is spirited, but self controlled and friendly. He was bred as a hunting dog and will

tackle almost anything that will run and fight. He varies in his acceptance of other animals, but is affectionate with people and makes a natural watch dog. This terrier is calm, well mannered and easily wins friends.

Background: In the past, the Welsh Terrier was known as the Old English Terrier or Black-and-Tan Wire Haired Terrier. These terriers were first brought to this country in 1888 and shown in the old Madison Square Garden under the Miscellaneous Class.

Approved by the AKC: August 10, 1993; Effective September 29, 1993.

Show Ring: General: It is a sturdy. compact, rugged dog. Size: Males are about 15 in. at the withers, (acceptable range between 15 and 15½). Bitches may be proportionally smaller. Weight: 20 lbs. considered average. Eyes: Small, dark brown and almond-shaped. Ears: V-shaped, small, but not too thin. Coat: Wiry, and dense with a close-fitting thick jacket. There is a short, soft undercoat. Nose: Black and squared off. Feet: Small, round, and catlike. Tail: docked to a length approximately level with the back part of the skull, to complete the square image of the whole dog. The root of the tail is set well up on the back. It is carried upright. Bite: A scissors bite is preferred, but a level bite is acceptable. *Color:* The jacket is black, spreading up onto the neck, down onto the tail and into the upper thighs. The legs, quarters, and head are clear tan. The tan is a deep reddish color, with slightly lighter shades acceptable. A grizzle jacket is, also, acceptable.

**Breeding and Whelping:** They are generally easy breeders. Litter sizes are from 5 to 6 with mostly black pups weighing from 4-9 oz. Dewclaws, should be removed and tails docked on the 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> day.

Faults: Any deviation from the standard should be considered a fault; the seriousness of the fault depending upon the extent of the deviation. An overly aggressive or shy dog or bitch will be penalized.

Disqualifications: None.

**Recognized Problems:** There are few congenital abnormalities with the exception of **luxated lens**.

**Old Age:** The average life span is 10 years, although many live longer.

## **Fall Rally Classes**

Classes are for handlers who already know how to train dogs, but who want to learn the Rally exercises and practice sequences and courses. Dogs in the class should have learned how to learn and know some basic behaviors (e.g., heel, sit, down), but need not have polished behaviors to participate.

Because classes are on Sunday mornings, and participants are welcome to drop in as they can, handlers are strongly advised to read the AKC Rally Regulations (only 10 pages) and descriptions of the signs and how to perform the exercises (see "Regulations" and "Resources" at:

http://www.gracegift.info/rally/rally\_index.html).

Because the schedule is irregular and drop-ins are welcome, rather than registering for a series of classes, participants will pay on a per-lesson basis (\$5 per lesson).

The number of participants will be limited, so preregistration (via e-mail or phone) is required for EACH lesson. If lessons fill to capacity, interested participants will be put on a waiting list and allowed to attend if space becomes available. Participants are welcome to attend both lessons each day.

Introduction to Rally: novice sians and sequences. understanding of heeling as done in obedience. standard including changes of pace and turns, is a big plus. Of the 31 exercises in novice Rally, 7 are used in standard obedience (changes of pace, turns, automatic sit). The remaining 24 "new" exercises will be introduced over the 6 weeks. Sequences will be designed to help participants learn to transition smoothly from one sign to the next.

Advanced and excellent signs and sequences: course work.. This class is for handlers and dogs who are ready (or nearly ready) to show in novice Rally and those preparing for advanced and excellent Rally.

Handlers should know how to perform all the novice exercises.

## **New Canine Virus**

A NEW STRAIN OF INFLUENZA that began infecting dogs in Florida early last year has recently struck hard in the Westchester area, forcing the temporary closure of two kennels after more than 100 dogs being boarded there became ill, veterinary officials say. At least one of the dogs has since died.

The symptoms mimic those of bordetella, a less virulent illness commonly known as kennel cough. Health officials fear that this similarity has contributed to underreporting of the spread of the new illness, both locally and nationally.

There is not yet any vaccine for the new virus, which is believed to have jumped from horses to dogs last year. Nor has it yet been officially named or detailed in the scientific literature. At this point, diagnosis can be confirmed only through blood tests performed at the Cornell University College of Veterinary Medicine, and results take as long as two weeks. Dogs do not yet have any natural immunity to this illness.

The researcher who first isolated the virus in greyhounds, Cynda Crawford, is a veterinary immunologist at the University of Florida College of Veterinary Medicine in Gainesville.

About 80 percent of dogs infected with the disease will show symptoms, Dr. Crawford predicted. These include "a moist, productive cough that ends in a gagging response, that will persist for one to four weeks, despite treatment with antibiotics or cough suppressants." Although antibiotics have no effect on the virus itself, they may prevent secondary bacterial infections.

"Some dogs develop a thick, yellow discharge from the nose," she added. "A very few dogs will spike a high fever, between 105 to 107 degrees F. They become lethargic and weak, with rapid, shallow breathing. This is likely to progress to pneumonia," which is where antibiotic treatment can help.

As many as 10 percent of dogs will die of the disease, she believes. Bordetella, by contrast, is rarely fatal among adult dogs.
