Sussex Spaniel: Dog of the Month

Sporting Group

The Sussex Spaniel,



niel, has short legs, a massive build, a long body and a habit of giving tongue when on scent making the breed ideally suited to pene-

trating the dense undergrowth and flushing game within range of the gun. The breed has a somber and serious expression, but despite this, it is friendly and has a cheerful and tractable disposition.

Background: The Sussex Spaniel was among the first ten breeds to be recognized and admitted to the *Stud Book* when the AKC was formed in 1884, originating in the kennels of a Mr. Fuller in Sussex, England. It continues today essentially unchanged from those 19th century sporting dogs.

AKC Approved: April 7, 1992 Effective May 27, 1992

Show Ring: Size: 13 to 15 in. Weight: 35 to 45 lbs.. Eyes: Hazel in color, fairly large & soft.. Ears: Thick, fairly large and set moderately low. Coat: Abundant, flat or slightly waved, with no tendency to curl. Feet: Large and round with short hair between the toes. Tail: docked from 5 to 7 inches and set low. Bite: A scissors bite is preferred. Color: Rich golden liver is the only acceptable color. Trimming: None is acceptable except to shape the foot feather. Enough feather should be left to cover the nails.

Breeding and Whelping: They are not easy breeders because of the

large variation in time of ovulation and disinterest on the part of the male. Bitches often make no effort to open the sac or cut the cord, but once the pups are clean and breathing well, they usually make excellent mothers. There has been much inbreeding in the past 60 years and it is not unusual to lose half of a litter during the first 2 weeks of life. Litter sizes are from 2 to 8 with pups weighing from 4-6 oz. Dewclaws, may be removed and tails should be docked on the 3rd to 4th day. Male pups are generally stronger with respiratory problems common to all.

Faults: Major:. Dark liver or puce coat color. White on any part of the body other than the chest.

Minor: Any deviation from the height measurements. Any deviation from a scissors bite. White on the chest.

Disqualifications: None.

Recognized Problems: Heart murmurs, Enlarged hearts and Intervertebral disc syndrome.

Old Age: The average life span is 10 to 12 years. Carcinomas are common, especially in unneutered dogs and bitches.

We had 43 different breeds represented. 18 Shelties topped the list followed by 16 Border Collies, 12 Aussies, 10 Border terriers, 9 Goldens, 8 Dobes, 7 Pembroke Corgi's, 7 Belgian Tervurens, 5 Labs. 4 each of Portuguese Water Dogs, Springer Spaniels, Parson Russell Terriers, and Cardigan Corgis, 3 Vizslas and many other breeds including one American Foxhound for the first time.

Tracy Fletcher once again orchestrated the course building for all 14 courses and made a difficult job look simple. Richard Whorton handled all the secretarial paperwork and Peggy Schmidt cheerfully handed out ribbons and prizes to the delighted recipients. DKC Awards Overview

Each year DKC holds an awards banquet to recognize and honor its members for their achievements throughout the award year. The awards year runs from January 1 to December 31 and the banquet is held in February the following year.

In order to apply for awards you must be a regular member in good standing and perform two services for the club during the award year. Applications for awards will be available at the building and on our website November 1 of each year. The following is an overview of the awards. If you have any questions or need further information please contact Lisa Roberts at 919-602-5788 or wonderdogs@earthlink.net.

Canine Good Citizens

DKC presents a certificate to each member that earned an AKC Canine Good Citizen during the award year.

Breeders Certificate

DKC presents a certificate to each member for each dog that they bred who earns an AKC title during the awards year.

Title Plaques

DKC presents each member with a plaque or similar item that recognizes the AKC titles the dog earned during the award year

The following are traveling trophies. The recipient holds the trophy for one

year. It is then returned to DKC to be awarded for the next year.

Fowler Show Bitch

This trophy was donated by W. Herman Fowler, Jr. It is to be awarded annually to the member's bitch with the most impressive show record during the past year.

Haines Show Dog

This trophy was donated by Vivian and Howard Haines. It is to be awarded annually to the member's dog with the most impressive show record during the past year.

Kartye Brood Bitch

This trophy, one of a pair donated by Peter Kartye, is awarded annually to the DKC member/owner, or co-owner, of the brood bitch whose sons and daughters, in the opinion of the Awards Committee, have compiled the most notable record of achievement. This award can apply to conformation, obedience or tracking, and can be based upon titles earned during prior years.

Kartye Stud Dog

This trophy, one of a pair donated by Peter Kartye, is awarded annually to the DKC member/owner, or co-owner, of the stud dog whose sons and daughters, in the opinion of the Awards Committee, have compiled the most notable record of achievement. This award can apply to conformation, obedience or tracking, and can be based upon titles earned during prior years.

Hill Breeder's Trophy

This trophy was donated by Frances Hill. It is awarded annually to a member in recognition of their breeding program. The criteria for this award are:

- number of show champions bred during the preceding FIVE years
- number of breed or better placements during the PREVIOUS year (award year)
- number of studs active during the year
- number of brood bitches active during the year
- number of puppies whelped during the year
- national rating of dogs of the breeder

Grimson Tracking

This trophy, to be awarded annually, was donated by Keith and Mozelle

Grimson. It is to be awarded to the dog or bitch that has most distinguished itself in tracking activities during the preceding twelve months. The winner is to be selected on the basis of encouragement as well as achievement.

Luster Novice Obedience Trophy

The Novice Obedience Award donated by Dr. and Mrs. Michael Luster is awarded each year to the dog or bitch, owned or co-owned by a DKC member, earning a CD during the year with the highest average for the three qualifying legs.

Telander Open A Obedience Trophy

This award is donated by Jeff and Jodi Telander. It is to be awarded annually to recognize the dog or bitch, owned by a DKC member, earning a Companion Dog Excellent title with the highest three qualifying legs in Open A classes.

White Utility A Obedience Trophy

This award is donated by Marjorie J. White. It is offered annually to recognize the dog or bitch, owned and handled by a DKC member, who during the year earned a Utility title from the Utility A classes. The <u>first three</u> qualifying scores upon which the UD title is earned are the only scores to be considered in awarding this trophy.

Thompson Obedience Trophy

This trophy was donated by Mrs. M. J. Thompson. It is awarded to the member's dog or bitch excelling in obedience during the past year.

The trophy can be earned for CD's and up and is based on performance

Roberts Novice A Agility Trophy

The Roberts Novice A Agility Trophy was donated in 2003 by Lisa Roberts. It is to be awarded each year to the dog or bitch, owned or co-owned by a DKC member, earning a Novice Agility and Novice Agility Jumpers from the Novice A classes. The trophy will be awarded to the dog with the highest average score of the first three qualifying legs for both titles.

Schmidt Novice B Agility Trophy

The Schmidt Novice B Agility Trophy was donated in 2003 by Peggy Schmidt. It is to be awarded each year to the dog or bitch, owned or co-owned by a DKC member, earning a Novice Agility and Novice Agility Jumpers from the Novice B classes. The trophy will be awarded to the dog with the highest average

score of the first three qualifying legs for both titles.

Barnett Open Agility Trophy

The Barnett Open Agility Trophy was donated in 2003 by Jan Barnett. It is to be awarded each year to the dog or bitch, owned or co-owned by a DKC member, earning an Open Agility and Open Agility Jumpers title. The trophy will be awarded to the dog with the highest average score of the first three qualifying legs for both titles.

The One Ash ST. Pauli Girl Excellent Agility Trophy

Donated by Denise & Mark McDonald in 2003 to the dog or bitch, owned by a DKC member, with the highest average score earned in the Excellent classes which qualified him/her for the AX and AXJ title.

Whorton Agility Trophy Most Consistent Agility Dog Award

Donated by Mary Whorton in 2003, this trophy is being offered in the memory of the first dog to earn the MACH title at DKC, OTCh MACH3 Tystar Little Dipper UDX. This trophy is to be awarded to the agility dog who earns the most double Qs from the excellent B regular classes throughout the year.

Good Sportsmanship, Service Award, and Dog World Nominations

The <u>SPORTSMANSHIP</u> Award is be given yearly to a DKC member who exemplifies the word <u>sportsmanship</u>. The recipient should be a person who is unselfish; who shares his/her time and resources willingly with others; who is happy for another's wins and sorry for losses; who is a gracious winner and loser.

Two (2) <u>SERVICE</u> Medallions are awarded annually for outstanding service to the club. This does not have to be a high-profile person and is often given to a member who is not in the spotlight but who is always serving the club.

The <u>DOG WORLD</u> Award is given every 2 years. It is awarded for outstanding service and involvement in dog activities (DKC, individual breed clubs, dog training clubs, education, rescue, teaching, showing, mentoring, therapy work, etc.). It will be given in 2006 for the 2005 calendar year.

Special Recognition Awards

These awards appear on the large wall plaques at the DKC building.

Holland Versatility Trophy

This trophy, first awarded in 1983, was donated by Hank Holland in honor of his wife. Mary Holland was a very active member of our club right up until her death in 1982. This trophy is awarded annually to a member's dog or bitch who achieves its <u>championship</u> and a <u>tracking, obedience, or agility</u> title during the same 12 month period.

The Gray Versatility Trophy

This trophy was donated in 2003 by Jan Gray for the dog who has exhibited the most versatility over its lifetime. A conformation Championship is *not* required to earn this trophy. This will be decided based on a point system.

Missing

It was suddenly back and then a Rally Card that was needed went missing. This is very frustrating for those who are responsible for making these events function smoothly.
