Basenji: Dog of the MonthHound Group



The **Basenji**, is an intelligent, independent, but affectionate and alert breed. It cleans itself all over like a cat

and has no doggy smell. Although it is known as the barkless dog, it is not silent, but makes a noise when happy between a chortle and yodel. They can be aloof with strangers.

Background: The Basenji is one of the oldest known breeds and is recorded as having lived in Ancient Egypt. It was first brought from Africa to England and the US in 1937. The American female and her litter did not live and it was not until 1941 that the US had its first surviving breeding pair.

AKC Approved: May 8, 1990 Effective: June 28, 1990.

Show Ring: Size: Ideal height for dogs is 17" and bitches 16". Approx. weight for dogs, 24 lbs. and bitches, 22 lbs. Eyes: Dark hazel to dark brown, almond shaped, obliquely set and farseeing. Rims dark. Ears: Small, erect and slightly hooded. Wrinkles appear upon the forehead when ears are erect Bite: Scissor. Nose: Black. Coat: Short and fine. Feet: Small, oval and compact. Tail: Set high on topline, bends acutely forward and lies well curled over to either side. Color: Chestnut red: pure black; tricolor (pure black and chestnut red); or brindle (black stripes on a background of chestnut red); all with white feet, chest and tail tip.

Breeding and Whelping: Basenji bitches come into season only once a year in the fall in the northern

hemisphere. The estrus period may last up to 4 weeks with the bitches accepting as early as 5 days and as late as 15. Bitches whelp easily and are excellent mothers. Litter size averages 5-6 with pups weighing 6-8 oz. **Umbilical hernias** are common. Many breeders gently push the hernia back during puppyhood and the opening closes leaving only a fatty layer. All dewclaws are usually removed. Level or undershot bites tend to become more pronounced.

Defects: Any departure from the from the standard.

Disqualifications: None.

Recognized Problems: Persistent pupillary membrane (The degree of severity varies. It may obscure vision or only be discernable with a slit lamp), PK (a variety of hemolytic anemia which requires 2 genes to cause symptoms and for which there is a test for carrier and affected dogs), hernias and coliform enteritis. There is a high incidence of inherited gastrointestinal track problems in Basenjis.

Old Age: The average life span is 10 to 13 years.

New Agility Regulations

The AKC Board reviewed a number of proposed amendments to the Agility Regulations as recommended by the AKC Agility Advisory Committee. They included:

- The addition of the 26" class furthers the growth and International aspect of AKC Agility.
- The addition of the new titling program (PAX) for the Preferred class expands the ability for many extreme breeds, veteran dogs and veteran handlers to continue to compete in the sport of agility at a higher level.
- The new titling class "FAST" will address the fancy's request for a new titling class consisting of advanced distance work and control. "FAST" will also bring additional entries for trials that do not currently reach their limits. Following a motion by Ms. Scully, seconded by Mrs.

Strand, it was VOTED (unanimously) to adopt the amendments to the Agility Regulations that are attached to these minutes. The effective date for the FAST class is January 1, 2007, with all of the other amendments effective September 1, 2006.
