Bouvier des Flandres

Herding Group



Bouviers give the feeling of great strength without any sign of weightiness or clumsiness in their overall makeup. They

are agile, spirited and bold, yet their serene, well behaved disposition conveys a steady and courageous character. Bouvier intelligence and scenting abilities allow them to perform as tracking dogs and guide dogs for the blind. They are trustworthy with children and make excellent companions and house dogs.

Background: The Bouvier originated in Southwest Flanders and on the French northern plain. Most of the early Bouvier owners and breeders were farmers, butchers or cattle merchants. A standard did not exist until 1912. In Belgium, a Bouvier cannot win the title of champion unless he has also won a prize in work-competition as a police, defense or army dog. The Bouvier des Flandres was first recognized by the AKC in 1929.

AKC Approved: January 10, 2000 Effective: February 23, 2000

Show Ring: Height: Dogs, 241/2" -271/2"; bitches, 231/2" to 261/2". Eyes: Dark brown and oval. Ears: Placed high and alert. Teeth: A scissors bite. Coat: A tousled, double coat capable of withstanding the hardest work in the most inclement weather. Color: From fawn to black, passing through salt and pepper, gray and brindle. A small white star on the chest is allowed. Feet: Both forefeet and hind feet are rounded and compact, turning neither in nor out; the toes close and well arched; strong black nails; thick tough pads. Tail: Docked and set high and aligned normally with the spinal column. Preferably carried upright in motion. Dogs born tailless should not be penalized. Breeding and Whelping: Although the breed is generally hardy, there is a large proportion of birthing problems including uterine inertia, associated with very large or small litters which can vary from

1 to 15 pups. The pups weigh 8 oz to 1½ lbs at birth; those weighing over a pound may be oversize at maturity. Dewclaws may be removed in front and must be removed in rear. Tail is to be docked, leaving 2 or 3 vertebrae. It is difficult to breed away from the overshot bite. Socialization is very important. Bouvier pups develop guarding tendencies as early as 12 weeks.

Faults: A short, squatty neck; steep shoulders; elbows which are too far out or in; a narrow, snipy muzzle; a coat too long, too short, silky, woolly or flat.

Serious Faults: Long-bodied, ears that are too low or too closely set, a sunken or slanted croup, brown, pink or spotted nose, overshot or undershot bites, sickle or cow-hocks, chocolate brown, white, or parti-color coat color, yellow or light eyes, size above or below Standard.

Disqualifications: There are no disqualifying faults.

Recognized Problems: Umbilical hernias & cleft palates in some bloodlines, reproductive difficulties, lymphosarcoma [middle or late years], torsion, elbow dysplasia, hypothyroidism.

Old Age: Life expectancy is 10 to 12 with dogs often outliving bitches. Grey dogs darken as they age and fawn dogs lighten.

Once again I am Coordinator for the Cluster Grounds Cleanup (aka "POOP PATROL") and Chair (aka "Chief Pooper Scooper") for the DKC show day on Friday, March 21st. Certainly this job is not #1 on the volunteer list! But, it's necessary to retain our show site that we improve grounds cleanup at the Fairgrounds and encourage exhibitors to pick up after their dogs. I've tried to make it

simple and not too onerous for workers. We don't expect them to spend the day picking up poop piles (unless they feel that motivated), but are simply asking them to patrol the grassy areas wearing Kennel Club Staff yellow vests.
