Brittany

Sporting Group



The Brittany, a strong and energetic dog, is compactly built but leggy and can cover ground quite rapidly. He is robust without

being clumsy. He can be tailless or has a tail docked to approximately four inches. He is a happy, alert dog, neither mean nor shy and adapts easily to apartment life. He can be timid if treated harshly.

Background: The first accurate records to pinpoint the actual Brittany-type dog are the paintings and tapestries of the 17th century. It was named for the French province in which it originated as early as AD 150. It seems likely the dogs of Brittany and Wales had the same ancestors and developed along similar paths, quite possibly interbreeding since the lands are close and there was much trade between the two. Good evidence for this supposition lies in the inherent resemblance existing between the Brittany and the Welsh Springer Spaniel. From 1934-1982, the Brittany was registered by the AKC as Spaniel,

Approved: April 10, 1990 Effective: May 31, 1990

Show Ring: *Height:* 17½ to 20½". Weight: Between 30 and 40 lbs. Eves: Well set in head. Well protected from briars by a heavy, expressive eyebrow. Ears: Set high, above the level of the eyes. Short and triangular, rather than pendulous. Teeth: A true scissors bite. Lips: Dry so that feathers will not stick. Coat: Dense, flat or wavy, never curly. Texture neither wiry nor silky. Color: Orange and white or liver and white in either clear or roan patterns. Some ticking is desirable. The orange or liver is found in the standard parti-color or piebald patterns. Washed out colors are not desirable. Tri-colors are allowed but not preferred. Feet: Halfway between

the hare and the cat foot. **Dewclaws:** may be removed. **Tail:** Tailless to approximately four inches, natural or docked.

Breeding and Whelping: They are free whelpers with litters averaging seven. Tails are docked leaving 3/4" on a two day old dog. Front dewclaws are often removed, but this is not required for show. Umbilical hernias are occasionally found

Penalties: A prominent full or popeye, tight nostrils. **Heavy penalties:** overshot or undershot jaw, profuse feathering or furnishings, a long body, light and mean-looking eyes, flat feet, splayed feet, paper feet, etc. and drooling.

Disqualifications: Under $17\frac{1}{2}$ " or over $20\frac{1}{2}$ " and black in the coat or nose.

Recognized Problems: Hip dysplasia and unilateral cryptorchidism are problems of the breed. Epilepsy by inheritance can show at the age of one. Hemophilia A [Factor VIII deficiency] is seen in this breed. The condition is a sex-linked recessive hereditary trait. Lipfold dermatitis occurs because of the pendulous upper lip. Treatment consists of clipping, cleaning and drying of involved area.

Old Age: Life expectancy is 12 to 13. Some can be hunted as late as 12 years of age. One Champion was still on the field-trial circuit at 9 years of age.

DKC Fall Show Trophy Chair

AKC Delegate Notes

Mar. 10 & 11, 2008-NYC, NY

Results of the Show Attendance Survey conducted by the All Breed Committee should be available by the first of April. These results will include items such as mileage considerations, saturation; cost of entries, and ideas for improving entries.

Discussion continued regarding an All-Breed Club Conference. The conference is currently in the planning stage and would be open to member clubs only.

Brochure is being made available "Guide to Activities for Clubs to Expand their Presence in the Community. This brochure will be available as a downloadable PDF file.

With regard to AKC fees, discussion was held regarding a prorating of refunds to entrants if a show has to be cancelled due to weather concerns.

AKC charges to member clubs for shows are inconsistent. The first All-Breed show, first Obedience and Agility Trials have no charge and yet, the first Rally Trial does. Recommendation is being made to the Board to remove the charge for the first Rally Trial as well.

The **Dog Show Rules Committee** discussed proposed changes to several classes.

Should entries into Veterans'

Classes count toward the number of points awarded? The committee decided that Veteran should remain a non-regular class. No dog entered in a non-regular class is eligible for points nor do they count into the computation for points. Winners of non-regular classes may compete in Best of Breed competition unless the class is judged after Best of Breed is awarded as a Special Attraction class.

- Should altered Veterans be allowed to compete in All-Breed Shows? The committee decided that only intact Veterans might compete, as dog shows are an exhibition of breeding stock.
- Bred By Exhibitor class criteria dogs must be six months of age, exhibitor must be a registered owner and breeder of the dog. Others may handle dog in subsequent classes.
- A Breeder Class is under consideration. The class would be along the lines of a brood-bitch or stud dog class, but with all entrants having the same breeder regardless of parentage.
- Questions and concerns were raised regarding the number of new dogs being approved. There are currently 63 new breeds under consideration over the next five years.

With regard to the AKC taking entries for Agility Trials. In 2004 the • AKC decided that they would go forward with plans for an Entry Service for Agility Trials. The Service went on-line in December 2007 and was successful. They are now starting with other trials; clubs do not have to use the AKC service but can elect to do so. The AKC can. provide services others cannot, I.e. dog eligibility at jump heights. The AKC has no plans on expanding into other venues at this time and have insured that discussions will be held with the Dog Show Superintendents' Association before they do. Pricing • should be competitive at \$2 for first entry and \$1 for each additional entry of the same dog.

Recommendation is being sent to Board of Directors to allow clubs to elect not to include exhibitors' addresses in show catalogs. Until the Board approves; it is suggested that exhibitors use club, business or email address as their address in the catalog to help protect privacy. Recommendation was made that a club should put a Breeder Referral advertisement in their catalogs giving the public an individual interested in a breed a contact. If an exhibitor would like to have all their contact information, the club might provide a "booster" page.

At the **Legislative Caucus** it was suggested that club members learn the process and go visit their legislators before there is negative legislation pending. Copies of the *AKC Legislative Manual* should be available at the next Delegates' Meeting.

The annual NAIA conference will be held in Windsor, CT the second week in August. Information can be found on the NAIA website.

Presentation was made on each of the AKC Affiliates — more information can be found through links on the AKC website.

AKC CAR Support and Relief Fund. Mission is to support search and rescue dogs. Grants are made to replace or train search and rescue dogs lost in the line of duty. \$1.9 million has been awarded in grants to date. Monies have also been made available to veterinary units for the purchase of mobile vet units to be used in disaster relief.

AKC Canine Health Foundation. Mission is to provide monies for basic and applied health programs regarding dog genetics. Founded in 1995 by AKC, Purina, clubs, and individuals. \$20 million has been allocated in 400 studies both long and short term.

AKC Museum of the Dog. Founded in 1979 and a national museum devoted to the purebred dog and human/canine relationship. Moved in 1983 to St Louis where it houses 700 items covering all venues.

AKC PAC Operates in the political arena by contributing monies to legislative officials. It is funded by contributions of individual members of clubs and AKC employees.

AKC Legislative Support Fund arranges lobbying activities. Funded by clubs and organizations.

AKC Humane Fund was established to broaden base of dog lovers and

to respond to public perception of belonging. Mission is Humane Education with all animal lovers the target audience. "Education makes a Difference."

The **President's Report** honored AKC's long time employees.

2007 Year-to-Date compared to 2006 **financial highlights**:

Operating revenues \$72.8 million compared with \$72.3 million.

Operating expenses \$68.4 million compared with \$69.0 million.

Operating surplus \$4.4 million compared with \$3.2 million.

Investment gain \$5.9 million compared with \$7.1 million.

Net surplus \$10.4 million compared with \$10.4 million.

Litter registrations down 6.6 percent (peaked at 564K in 1997, was 402K in 2007).

Dog registrations down 5.2 percent (peaked at 1.5 million in 1992).

Dog registrations were up \$1.7 million due to increase in fees.

Royalties and Sponsorships were up \$442K.

Core business groups (dog events) were down \$6.8 million; Non-Core (Royalties, sponsorships, etc were up \$12.4 million.

The AKC Publication Department recently received ten awards on the Family Dog and AKC Gazette.

Proposed amendment to Chapter 3, Section 7 of Rules Applying to Registration and Discipline, which would allow for a dog's name to be changed under certain provisions without impacting the AKC Stud Book or event records. The dog must have been whelped in the US and in cases where the breeder first registered the dog, their written consent

must be obtained. A name containing a Registered Kennel Name cannot be changed without the written consent of the owner of the Registered Kennel Name. No name can be changed once the dog has produced or sired an AKC registered litter or received an award at an AKC licensed or member event. This amendment was adopted.

Items to be voted on at the next Delegates' Meeting:

- Proposed amendment to Chapter 11, Section 6 of Rules Applying to Dog Shows: Dog Show Entries, Conditions of Dogs affecting Eligibility, which would benefit exhibitors of incorrectly entered dogs by moving their dogs into the open class as well as all those entered by providing the opportunity to maintain the number of dogs entered and counted toward the computation of Championship points.
- Proposed amendment to Chapter 17, Section 2 of Rules Applying to Dog shows: Submission of a show's records to AKC, which would make the Rules consistent with the Bylaws, which charge the Board with the setting of fees. (The fee amount is currently part of the Rule.)
- Proposed amendment to Chapter 2, Section 1 of Rules Applying to Dog Shows: Making Application to Hold a Dog Show, which would make the Rules consistent with the Bylaws, which charge the Board with the setting of fees. (The fee amount is currently part of the Rule.)
- Proposed amendment to Chapter 2, Section 13 of Rules Applying to Dog Shows: Making Application of Hold a Dog Show, which would make the Rules consistent with the Bylaws, which charge the Board with the setting of fees. (The fee amount is currently part of the Rule.)

Antique Dog Collars

The collection of antique dog collars at the popular tourist site of Leeds Castle, four miles east of Maidstone in England, spans five centuries and is the most comprehensive collection of its kind in the world.

The collection has more than 100 collars and related exhibits tracing the history of canine neckwear from Medieval times to the present day.

Many of the early iron dog collars, studded with fearsome spikes and dating from as far back as the fifteenth century, were designed to protect hunting dogs' throats from attacks from wolves, bears, and wild boar which roamed the early European forests.

Other exhibits include the craftsmanship of German and Austrian Baroque leather collars from the seventeenth century, which are decorated with metalwork and velvet.
