Irish Terrier

Terrier Group

The Irish terrier is the raciest member of the terrier group, with a longer body and longer legs than the other terriers.



The early Irish Terrier was a pet, guard dog, and hunter and he still shows those traits. He is good tempered, spirited

and game. There is a heedless, reckless pluck about the Irish Terrier which is characteristic, and which, coupled with the headlong dash, blind to all consequences, with which he rushes at his adversary, has earned for the breed the proud epithet of "Daredevil." He is of good temper, most affectionate, and absolutely loyal to mankind.

Background: The Irish Terrier is one of the oldest of the terrier breeds. Early Irish terriers came in a variety of colors, including black and tan, gray and bridle; only near the end of the 19th century did the solid red color become a fixture of the breed. He has the distinction of being the only all-red terrier.

In World War I the Irish Terrier was used as a messenger and sentinel.

The first record of the Irish Terrier being shown as a recognized breed dates back to 1875 in Glasgow, Scotland.

Approved: December 10, 1968

Show Ring: Size: The most desirable weight in show condition is 27 lbs for the dog and 25 lbs. for the bitch. The height at the shoulder should be approximately 18 in. These figures serve as a guide only. Eves: Dark brown in color: small. not prominent; full of life, Ears: Small and V-shaped; of moderate thickness. Teeth: Should be strong and even. Lips: Should be close and well-fitting, almost black in color. Nose: Must be black. Coat: Should be dense and wiry in texture, rich in quality. Single coats, which are without any undercoat, and wavy coats are undesirable; the curly and the kinky coats are most objectionable. *Color:* Should be whole-colored: bright red, golden red, red wheaten, or wheaten. A small patch of white on the chest, is permissible but not desirable. *Feet*: Should be fairly round, small, and compact with black toenails. *Tail:* Should be docked. It should be set rather high, but not curled.

Breeding and Whelping: The Irish Terrier Bitch whelps easily and is usually an excellent mother. Litters usually range from 4 to 8 weighing about 8 oz. at birth. Puppies sometimes have black hair at birth, which should disappear before they are full grown.

The tail is docked to three-quarters. Dewclaws are removed. maintaining good ear carriage can be a problem. A slight overbite will often correct itself by 7 or 8 months.

Bad Fault: Light or yellow eye.

Severe Penalty: A "dead" ear, hound-like in appearance.

Recognized Problems: This breed is one of 14 which has a tendency to **cystine stones** in males. They are subject to **hot spots** in summer. Daily brushing and combing are important.

Old Age: The life expectancy is from 12 to 15 years. There are no old age illnesses specific to Irish Terriers.

Congress Overrides Veto; Farm Bill Becomes Law

[Friday, May 23, 2008]

Yesterday, Congress enacted the federal Farm Bill, including provisions prohibiting animal fighting ventures and limiting the importation of live dogs into the United States if the dogs are younger than six months old and imported for the purpose of resale. President Bush's earlier veto of the bill was overridden when the House of Representatives voted 316-108 on Wednesday, and the Senate voted 82-13 on Thursday to override, easily exceeding the two-thirds majority required of both houses to override a presidential veto.

The override was not without controversy, as a printing mistake left out 34 pages of the vetoed bill that dealt with international food aid and trade. Realizing the mistake of voting for a different version of the bill than what the President had vetoed, the House voted again (306-110) in favor of the complete bill. enough to override another Presidential veto. The Senate is expected to revisit the measure in June if necessary. However, both House and Senate leadership have cited parliamentary precedent regarding such an occurrence as being constitutional and therefore not needing another vote.
