#### **Treibball: A New Dog Sport from Germany**

(www.associatedcontent.com, 9/30/2010)... According to the North American Treibball Association, Treibball, also known as Driving Ball or Herding Ball, is a new dog sport that originated in Germany. Treibball requires your dog to herd eight large fitness balls into a net, similar to a soccer goal, in 15 minutes or less. This dog sport is great exercise for all dogs, large and small, and develops concentration and independent thinking. Treibball is the perfect sport for herding and sporting dogs.

Treibball, developed by Jan Nijboer in 2003, became a competitive sport in Europe in 2007. Many dog training schools in the United States are adding Treibball

to their course offerings, especially in the Midwest and California. In Treibball classes, dogs learn to move large, 22-34", air-filled balls into a net or a pen and the dog handlers learn how to incorporate distance work to direct the dog. The handler signals the dog, guiding it to go out to the balls and wait for the herding command. The dog handler directs the dog to go right or left to begin herding the balls into the net using a series of hand signals, whistles, or verbal commands. Treibball

is very similar to herding a flock of sheep and is ideal for dogs that want to work.

#### Treibball Rules

The eight different colored Treibball fitness balls are arranged in a triangle similar to a game of pool, 15 feet away from the goal net. The dog handler stands to the right of the net or pen and cannot enter the herding area that is the length of half a soccer field. When the start whistle blows, the dog has 15 minutes to herd the balls into the net. The dog has to push the

balls into the net in a certain color order and the handler directs the dog with distance commands to the correct ball.

Yelling, or pressuring the dog in any way results in a time penalty. Advanced Treibball competitors push the balls through narrow passages and water obstacles; beginner handlers and dogs just need to get the colored balls into the pen.

Treibball is not as easy as it sounds and before beginning Treibball training, the dog should know the basic obedience behaviors sit, stay, down, heel, and come. Treibball requires dogs to work off-leash, so a reliable recall is necessary.



- 4) Microchip clinics 3 times a year during classes. There will be a spring health clinic at the building 2/26/11 with many tests available.
- 5) Dog photo days. This will be at the DKC building in late summer/early fall, with DKC members who are photographers and some non-DKC members. There will be several stations set up--a Christmas scene, portraits, outdoor shots, etc. More details soon.
- 6) Craft fair. We will rent booth space to different craft vendors and sell food
- 7) We would like to have club members man the admissions booths for our shows in Raleigh, and act as stewards instead of hiring the professional stewards. This would save us a lot of money on each show, but will

require more people to step forward and volunteer. We are not planning this to be forever, but if we are going to expand our facilities, it will require some sacrifice from everyone for a few years.

#### Cornbread

(Yvonne Millspaugh)

- 1 Package (7oz.) of Martha White Sweet Yellow Cornbread & Muffin Mix (I get @ Food Lion)
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 Cup sour cream
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted

#### **DKC Meeting Minutes: October 18, 2010**

Program: "AKC's and NC Dog Federation's Role with NC Dog Legislation," delivered by Sheila Goffe and Steve Wallis. Ms. Goffe spoke about the role of AKC's 6 Government Relations Division employees who work on the national, state, and local levels. They provide education and information to all groups and individuals who need assistance with educating themselves and their legislators and government leaders on dog laws. Animal extremists/rights groups may attempt to tighten existing laws or pass laws that restrict or govern the way people are able to utilize or own animals. AKC tracks the federal and state attempts at these laws (doubled in last 2 years) and has around 20 policy statements on topics such as BSL, breeder restrictions, cruelty, etc. Their office trains people on how to read legislation, empowerment, letter writing, etc. and works with coalitions (like NC Dog Federation) on educating about responsible dog ownership. Constituents and community involvement are key to educating representatives. Steve Wallis spoke about the voting history of area politicians and how the NC Dog Federation is allowing Associate Membership for \$15.00 or more per year. A request for a permanent lobbyist to represent state Kennel Club interests is also under consideration.

Meeting called to order: 9:00 pm by President George Beglane.

New Business: George Beglane requested members to volunteer for a new committee (to be named later). This committee will explore the direction of the DKC for 2011 and beyond. Where are we going? What are we doing? What are our future activities? Building additions or renovations? Please contact George if you are interested in participating on this committee.

- Corresponding Secretary: George announced for Ann Carter that DKC is hosting a Halloween Party on Friday, Oct 29th, from 6-9pm.
- Treasurer's Report: George reported for Roger Akers the account figures provided in each fund.
- Spring Show: Connie Howard requests that someone volunteer for Obedience Chair portion of the show; please contact her if you are interested. Sponsorships for Breed Awards and Obedience Classes, please mail checks to Diane Kessler.
- Fall Show: Cathy Rubens received 2 thank you notes from judges. Committee is looking for a Rally Chair, Trophy Chair, and Hospitality Chair. We can now combine breed club sweepstakes as well as regional and national specialties with the trial- if you or your club are interested, please call Cathy Rubens for more information.
- Tracking: Jack Sappenfield reported that our 2 judges will conduct TDX trial on October 24 at Quail Roost Farm beginning at 10:30am.
- Breeder Referral: Nothing to report.

- Agility trial: George stated that Fall Show seemed to do well, had great weather, and included that the agility trial may net around \$3,000.00.
- Obedience and Rally Trial: Jan Gray reported that entries are coming in already. If you are able to work or enter, please do! Dana Pritchett recommended that people forward the premium to some friends on their email lists.
- Obedience classes: Pet Therapy starts Tuesday, October 19, 2010.
- · Agility classes: Are ongoing.
- Conformation classes: Nancy Adams stated that they are training someone to add to the pool of instructors for the handling class, which includes Connie Howard and Lynn Reagan-Hull.
- AKC Delegate report: No report
- Seminars: We have flyers in lobby and up on website.
   More mini-seminars are scheduled, including clicker, track laying, and K9 nose work.
- Membership Report: Terri Toohill requested that we vote on our 1 Regular Membership: Sharon Berthold was unanimously approved.
