More Fat, Less Protein Improves Canine Olfactory Abilities

From sniffing out bombs and weapons

to uncovering criminal evidence, dogs can help save lives and keep the peace. Now, researchers have uncovered how to improve dogs' smelling skills through diet, by cutting protein and adding fats. Such a diet, say the researchers, appears to help dogs return to lower body temperatures after exercise, which reduces panting and, thereby, improves sniffing. The findings could change how detection dogs are fed and boost their detection abilities, says Joseph Wakshlag, associate professor of clinical studies and chief of nutrition at Cornell's College of Veterinary Medicine. Wakshlag, who collaborated with researchers at Auburn University, is presenting the findings at the Companion Animal Nutrition Summit in Atlanta, held March 22-24. The study, funded with a \$1 million grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, also found that detection dogs are more reliable detectors than previously thought. The study is the first to be conducted in the world's only detection dog research facility designed in conjunction with a military dog trainer. The Alabama facility, which provides expert detection dogs to police and military forces, flushes out fumes between tests, ensuring a fresh field each time. "Previous studies from other facilities, which lack this feature, had suggested detection dogs signaling for suspect substances are about 70 percent accurate," said Wakshlag. "The lower numbers may have been due to study design flaws which our new study overcame. Dogs tested in the new facility signaled with 90 percent

and above accuracy. We also found we can push detection performance even further with the right kind of food." Bucking conventional thinking, the group found that less protein and more fat in the dogs' diet helped trained dogs perform better in exercise and detection tests. During an 18-month period, they rotated 17 trained dogs through three diets Wakshlag selected: a high-end performance diet, regular adult dog food, and regular adult dog food diluted with corn oil. Measuring how different diets affected each dog, they found that dogs eating the normal diet enhanced with corn oil returned to normal body temperatures most quickly after exercise

and were better able to detect smokeless powder, ammonia nitrate and TNT. "Corn oil has lots of polyunsaturated fats, similar to what you'd find in a lot of nuts and common grocery store seed oils," said Wakshlag. "Past data from elsewhere suggest that these polyunsaturated fats might enhance the sense of smell, and it looks like that may be true for detection dogs. It could be that fat somehow improves nose-signaling structures or reduces body temperature or both. But lowering protein also played a part in improving olfaction." Wakshlag designed the high-performance and corn-oil diets to have the same amount of energy from fat (57 percent). But the corn oil diet had less protein: 18 percent compared with 27 percent in the regular and high-performance diets. "If you're a dog, digesting protein raises body temperature, so the longer your body temperature is up, the longer you keep panting, and the harder it is to smell well," said Wakshlag. "Our study shifts the paradigm of what 'high-performance' diet can mean for dogs. It depends on what you want your dog to do. A sled dog or greyhound may need more protein to keep going. But detection dogs tend to exercise in shorter bursts and need to recover quickly and smell well. For that, less protein and more fat could help."

For everyone with large, deep-chested dogs, familiarize yourselves with the signs of bloat and gastric torsion (lot of info out there), be ready to act fast, and have a credit card just for emergencies. Cliff Notes version of my 10-year-old male standard poodle's terrible ordeal: Darkangel Ace of Spades, call name Lemmie, went from fine to severe distress in less than 10 minutes, with rigid, inflated sides, ineffective vomiting, and trying to hide from me. I got him to the emergency vet in less than 10 minutes, and x-rays showed that his stomach had already flipped. He was in shock. He was operated on so quickly he did not have any complications, such as needing sections of his stomach or intestine removed due to loss of blood supply, or losing his spleen. He is with me all the time, not an option for everyone, but we have heard of countless cases of people sleeping through their dogs' painful deaths, or kennel staff finding a boarder dog in crisis or already dead, or people who thought the dogs were just being obnoxious by refusing to go lie down. Always keep gas pills on hand, since they can sometimes stop a bloat from building to the point of torsion, and buy you some time until you can get to the vet. I'm feeling very fortunate right now that my dog, who never won a point and has no titles besides Best Boy In The World, is asleep on my couch after a full day of adoration from his fans at work, and not in a box on my credenza.

Joe & Henri McClees are the featured speakers at the next quarterly meeting of the NC Federation of Dog Clubs. They will give us their firsthand observations of what to expect in the way of animal related legislation this year. Durham Kennel Club members are invited, so I hope y'all can make the meeting on Saturday, April 6th, at 1:00pm at the NC Vet School.

The NCFDC Lobbyist fund solicitations are going well this month with a total of \$23,500 raised so far this year. Still we have a long way to go to meet this year's target and we are continuing to work on several more large donations. Associate member donations are, as always, also needed and welcome.

Legislation-wise, we are still waiting to see what bills will be introduced this session. In one proposal from The Humane Society of the United States (the bill is presently in Legislative Bill Drafting), "commercial breeder" is defined as anyone owning ten or more intact female dogs four months old or older. The bill imposes registration requirements (public record filings of breeder's address, number and breed of dogs, etc.), payment of an annual license fee (\$250.00), mandatory annual inspections, and standards of care and conditioning of animals taken directly from those currently required for inspection of county animal shelters.

While it may be possible for a hypothetical large commercial breeder to comply with this bill's regulations, it will put many dog owners out of the sport of dogs because of the onerous terms and standards they, too, will be required to meet if they happen to own ten intact bitches. Considering that only 0.25% of the nation's commercial dog breeders can be found in our state, the bill is viewed by many as unnecessary when current laws are working to address what problems we do have here.

An anti-dog ownership agenda is why HSUS's breeder licensing bills steadfastly address only "ownership" of dogs rather than the number of puppies being sold. This year's definition of "Commercial Breeder" doesn't even require dog owners to actually breed any of their dogs, only that they meet the minimum number of ten dogs owned! Note also, the ten dogs owned by a person don't even have to live on the owners property, so co-ownerships count toward the ten total as well.

The good news is this year HSUS legislative efforts may be meeting resistance from NC House and Senate leadership. The NC Senate has always been leery of animal rights-based legislation. Now, it appears the House may be holding back on animal rights bills as well. On their FaceBook page a month ago, House Republicans sought the public's comment on the need for a commercial dog breeder bill. The ensuing debate from public responders ended with more than a 5:1 ratio opposing a new commercial breeder law. Indeed, this may have been a definitive flash point that started NC House members paying attention to the large number of dog owners who are against the animal rights agenda. There is still a month to go before bills must be reported out of Bill Drafting to be considered in the Legislature this year.

At the shows in Raleigh, the NCFDC again had their booth to educate the public and the media who attended. Many people stopped by to find out who their elected representatives were and talk about legislation. Scores of cards with legislative contact information for constituents were handed out. If you do not know your own Senate and House members you can find this information by visiting the Federation's web page, www.NCDogClubs.org, or going to their FaceBook page.

Also, during the Raleigh shows several legislative members' staff attended AKC's "My Dog Can Do That" event on Saturday and later stopped by the Federation's booth and chatted, as had AKC's new Chief Operating Officer, Darrel Hendricks, earlier in the week. This year the Federation's booth helped make everyone aware of our presence, as did the page in the show catalog thanking the clubs on the circuit (including DKC) for supporting the Federation's efforts.
