SIMPLIFIED HEIGHT CARD PROCESS

Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the **Judge of Record** PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 24C" height division. However, if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present; **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog *before* its first run of the trial or cluster of trials.

If your dog needs to be measured, please check the appropriate box on the entry form regarding your dog's measurement status so the trial secretary knows whether to include you on the "Dogs to Be Measured" List. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's height card with your entry nor show it during the day of the trial.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

Please make checks payable to Durham Kennel Club (DKC). Checks made out incorrectly do not constitute a valid entry fee and your entry will be returned. No refunds granted for checks made in excess of the correct amount if overage equals less than \$10. There will be a \$30 fee for returned checks. All express mail must be left with no acceptance signature required. Entry form changes, additions, corrections and cancellations **MUST** be received in writing prior to the closing date, be legible and include the AKC number, or no refund will be issued. No telephone changes accepted.

ONLINE ENTRIES: You may enter this trial online using <https://labtestedonline.com>. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows. 30% online per day, 70% paper each day. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48-hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly. Vouchers cannot be used for online entries.

WAIT LIST POLICY: Entries for this trial are being accepted on a first-received basis until the closing date at 6:00 pm. DKC will be offering a wait list up until the closing date for those entries received in excess of the daily limits. No more than 25 entries will be included on the wait list. All entries, including those that are wait listed, must be received by the closing date. Any entries withdrawn by the closing date will be replaced by a wait listed entry (if available) and a full refund will be issued to the withdrawn entry. Any entry remaining on the waiting list after the closing date will receive a full refund. DKC will **NOT** be allowing entries from the waiting list into the trial after the closing date.

INITIAL CONFIRMATIONS: Preliminary confirmations will be emailed no later than 5 days after receiving your entry. If you don't receive an email within that timeframe, please contact the Trial Secretary.

FINAL CONFIRMATIONS: All entries will receive confirmations via e-mail. If you have not received a copy of your confirmation before the show, contact the Trial Secretary.

MIXED REGULAR AND PREFERRED

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. For example, the same dog may now be entered in Regular FAST and/or T2B to finish up those titles while also entered in Preferred Master STD/JWW to start working towards their PACH at the lower height. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed.

Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

FOR EXHIBITION ONLY (FEO)

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

- FEO allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. **FEO is offered for all classes at these trials.** FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.
- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the

results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.

- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out to the scribe and the judge.

FIX AND GO ON (FNG)

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are

familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

REFUNDS

Entry fees for bitches that come into season after the closing date will be refunded (minus a \$3.00 administrative fee per run) if a veterinarian certificate is presented to the trial secretary prior to the start of judging. Email is acceptable.

Refunds due to illness or injury of either dog and/or handler will be in the form of a voucher towards a future trial, less \$7 per run. A written veterinarian/physician letter (on office letterhead) must be given to the Trial Secretary no later 8:00 am on the day(s) for which a refund is being requested. Validation of the injury/illness must be made by a licensed veterinarian/physician and attest that the dog/handler cannot compete at this specific set of trials and/or provide a time period during which the dog/handler cannot compete. Requests from chiropractors, massage/physical therapists, etc. will not be accepted. All injury partial refunds are subject to verification.

No entry fees will be refunded if the Trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, or any other cause beyond the control of the Club. Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by vet or judge or barred from competition by action of the trial committee.

SITE INFORMATION

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. The following equipment will be used: MAX200 weave poles, MAX200 triples, MAD doubles, MAD broad jump, MAD tire, MAD winged & non-winged jumps, and MAD rubberized Table. Clip and Go rubberized contacts (Dogwalk, Teeter, and A-Frame).

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS

- Rosettes will be awarded to the first through fourth place dog in each jump height division in each class.
- A New Title ribbon will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.
- Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score.
- MACH/PACH Rosettes and a MACH/PACH bar will be given for earning a MACH/PACH title.
- A rosette will be given for earning the Agility Grand Champion title.

All ribbons must be claimed by the end of the Trial; none will be mailed.

MOVE-UPS

If a dog earns an agility title before this event it can be advanced to the next level of competition. Written notice (email is preferred) must be given to the Trial Secretary, no later than **the Monday before the trial by 6:00 pm**. Day to day move-ups will be offered – written notice must be provided no later than 15 minutes after the awarding of the ribbons for the last class on the day on which you earned the title. Move-ups will be added to the end of the running order of the class they move up to. No verbal changes will be accepted.

VOLUNTEERS

- Handlers are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs on the grounds and at the hotels. Handlers found to be in violation of either of these policies may be excused by the Trial Committee without benefit of refund.
- Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such cases, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Durham Kennel Club, its agents, members, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further, assume no responsibility for injury to children.
- Dogs are not required to be at the trial until the scheduled time of judging. All dogs not needed for further judging are excused. The owner/handler of each dog is solely responsible for having the dog ready at ringside when it is to be judged. Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.
- Dogs under 4 months of age are NOT permitted on the show grounds of AKC Agility Events.

- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.
- This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

The Durham Kennel Club drive is on the right side of the road and is marked by a blue sign. The gravel drive ends at the Durham Kennel Club building and the agility fields are behind the building.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners Program SM may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.
